

# Database Searching on the library catalog – Consumer Reports

If you're looking for articles from Consumer Reports about any subject, you can go to advanced search on our catalog to find them.

Type what you're searching in [All Headings](#) and consumer reports in [Journal Title](#).

Scroll down and uncheck [Swiftnet](#) and [Kansas Main Catalog](#) to avoid getting search results about books.

Select [Magazines, Journals, Newspapers & Books](#) to search all of the databases containing magazines articles from Consumer Reports. Click on [Search](#)
